



HEALTH ALERT:

Contaminated Heroin May Be In New York City

- The New York City Health Department believes that heroin contaminated with a dangerous drug called “Clenbuterol” may be in the City.
- Clenbuterol has made several people very sick already.
- If you feel sick – agitated, nauseous, weak, or have a headache –after using heroin, go to an emergency room right away, or call **911** for help.
- If you are not treated, you could get very ill, and even die.

If you are using heroin, recovery is possible, and help is available.
